Our first training centre opens in Speke - the Merseyside Engineering Training Centre (METC). Here, our apprentices receive 12 months of concentrated training in a purpose-built facility before returning to their employers.

MTC changes its name to North West Training Council, and NWTC, as we know it today, is born. The change of name reflects the organisation's proud heritage and better represents where our apprentices are from. Further training centres open in Aintree, Knowsley, Sefton, Wirral, Halton and Skelmersdale. At this time, NWTC expands its apprenticeship offer to include construction.

NWTC continues to expand its training portfolio, providing a wide range of apprenticeship programmes and commercial training from the Dunnings Bridge Road centre.

Supported by the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA), NWTC moves to a brand new facility – the Advanced Manufacturing Engineering Training Centre fully equipped to train 21st Century apprentices in the Industry 4.0 landscape. The move enables NWTC to compete on a national scale, providing the most up to date industry-relevant training using state of the art equipment

No one could have predicted the events of 2020 and the emergence of Covid-19. This sees NWTC demonstrate its ability to be flexible to meet the needs of our employers and apprentices through our digital approach and delivery of remote and blended teaching.


EQUIPMENT

Our new training centre is equipped with highly sophisticated training technology including:

The new training centre has been funded with £2.9m from the Local Growth Fund. Local Growth Funding is awarded to the Liverpool City Region Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) and invested through the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority through its Strategic Investment Fund.
